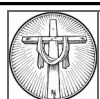

What does it mean to say that God raised Jesus from the dead? To begin with, the resurrection of the dead does not mean that Jesus simply returned to his former way of life. If that is the meaning of the resurrection, Jesus would have to die again, and death would be victorious over him. No, Jesus' resurrection was not a return to his former life; it was his entrance into an entirely new life that we will not understand until we experience our own resurrection at the resurrection of the dead.

The resurrection of Jesus has important implications for us who believe in him. For, what happened to Christ will happen to us if we remain faithful to Christ. Just as God raised Jesus from the dead, so God will raise from the dead those who belong to Christ. And just as Jesus entered into an entirely new life, so we will enter into a new life if we remain faithful to Christ. The resurrection of Jesus is the reason we believe that God will raise us from the dead.

This Easter Day is a glorious day for all us of because it provides us with so much hope: hope that God's love is more powerful than death; hope that we shall share in Christ's resurrection. Enjoy this day with your families and friends. Celebrate this day with your loved ones. But most of all find new faith and hope in this day: faith in Christ and hope for eternal life.
